



General Rules for Pistol, Rifle, Trap & Skeet Ranges

1. Use of Range is at your own risk.
2. Eye and ear protection is required at the range.
3. Persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol are prohibited from the range. No alcohol or drugs are permitted on the range.
4. Any member observing unsafe practices shall notify the executive committee.
5. Become familiar with the posted Medical Emergency protocols.



Specific Rules for Pistol & Rifle Ranges



- 1. Hours:**
 - Monday- Saturday 9AM to sunset; Sunday – 12 Noon to sunset
- 2. This is a Members Only Range – Member may be accompanied by no more than 2 (two) non-member guests. All persons under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.**
- 3. Shooters must be able to provide proof of membership.**
- 4. Prior to anyone going down range to change or put up targets, unload all firearms and holster or place firearm with action or cylinder open on bench. Make sure everyone on the range hears that you are going down range.**
- 5. Keep all loaded firearms pointed downrange in a safe direction at all times.**
- 6. Paper targets only. Targets shall be placed lower than shooter's shoulders. The only exception is steel targets made for range use. Shooters using steel targets do so at their own risk. Distance and angle of the target are essential for safe use and eliminating unsafe ricochets. Paper Targets need hung on target stands or on the chicken wire. No hanging targets on the cable.**



Specific Rules for Pistol & Rifle Ranges



- 7. Target distance and placement on both ranges needs to be backed by the berm. Targets, including steel targets need to be as close to the berm as possible. No targets in the middle of a range.**
- 8. Target height should be no higher than chest level and placement on both ranges needs to be level or lower than the trajectory of the bullet/shooters eye.**
- 9. No Ground Targets are Allowed. No targets objects on ridge top of berms. No shooting at poles. No targets placed on poles. No shooting at rocks. No pallets to hold targets. No shooting at the cable.**
- 10. Clean up spent shells and targets. Unwanted brass placed in brass barrel. Duds placed in the dud box – both are under the rifle range pavilion.**
- 11. Range may be closed to General Use for Training Programs or other Club activities.**
- 12. Do sign the range log book in the rifle range pavilion. Include name, date, time, guest names, and any noted range conditions not in order.**

Specific Rules for Trap & Skeet Ranges



- 1. Public Supervised Hours: for members and non-members**
 - **Monday & Thursday 6PM-9PM ; Saturday 1PM-4PM**
 - **Trap House is Open, All Shooters Must Sign-in**
- 2. Member use permitted during non-supervised hours using hand thrower only**
 - **Monday & Thursday 9AM-6PM ; Saturday 9AM – 1PM**
 - **Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, 9AM- sunset; Sunday 12 Noon – sunset**
 - **Trap House is Closed**
- 3. Clay pigeon targets only; please clean up shells after range use**
- 4. Only shotguns and low brass shells with shot size no larger than 6 shot allowed**
- 5. No driving of vehicles on the range**
- 6. No unsupervised children on the range**
