The club will run a pheasant taxidermy program in the February-March 2022 timeframe, so save an entire pheasant and freeze if you plan to join the next program session. Be careful to protect the tail feathers from being bent. Place a tag with your bird with your name, email, and phone number. Questions can be emailed to wayne@norco.club. In 2019, we had 16 students complete their birds in 2021. OK to place your pheasant in the Norco freezer (in a garbage bag, tagged with your name and contact info). Cost of the program is around \$50 plus pass the hat for lunchtime food.
