October 14th Members Meeting will be held at the clubhouse, meeting starts promptly at 7:30PM. Prior to the meeting, between 6PM-7PM Norco will have food to order – choice of venison and non-game meatloaf, side vegetables, If you have been missing the monthly members meetings, you are not earning those easy volunteer work credit hours.

At this October meeting, officer elections for 2022 will be held. To be eligible to vote, one as to be either a Full Regular Member or a Life Member. Associate and Junior Members can not vote. Positions being elected include President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, 5 Directors, 2 Trustees. To be eligible as a candidate, you will have to be a voting Regular member for 12 months or more. Associate members, the first level of membership, over time have to be recognized by the executive committee to be nominated and voted by the membership to become a Regular member. Recognition includes a minimum of 12 months of being an Associate member, being at most monthly members meetings, and volunteering often beyond the 15 hour minimum (for a reduced renewal rate).
