Planning ahead for April, volunteers will be needed for the April 9th Pond Area cleanup day, 8am-2pm, to ready the shores and the shed for the spring fishing derby that takes place the following weekend. Tasks may include shoreline brush/weed cutback; raking leaves, disposing of windblown range materials, etc Empty fish shed waste barrels, use club ATV; with waders, pull cat tails; in the shed, organize the tables for food service and prize table. Ensure fridge, stove, and grill are working and clean. Move grill from garage to fish shed. Work party has access to coffee, donuts, and a lunch Weather and wind permitting, burn the wood debris behind the pistol range. Setup hoses to suppress fire. Volunteer workers should bring their own tools and gloves – garden rake, pruners, hand saw, chain saw; brush saws, club also has tools to loan for the day. Club has premixed fuel for power tools. Planning ahead for the April 16th Spring Trout Derby, for cooking and prize table setup. Email wayne@norco.club . Club has approved funds for stocking – over 200 trout to be stocked – including brown, rainbow, and brook trout. There is a small entry fee to participate on April 16th and goes towards prizes for the first fish and largest fish caught between 8am-12N. There will be a prize table for kids who are fishing. This is a Norco member event with invited guests; due to the size of the pond – this is not a public fishing derby.

Norco monthly pistol pin shoots, held the last Sunday of every month, weather permitting, from April-October, from 12N-2PM. These shoots are fun, are open to members and their friends, with full size bowling pins. The objective is to shoot down 6 pins faster than your competitor with a handgun. The shoots are double elimination, whereby everyone will shoot at least twice; those winning through the series will shoot more. We recommend 2 boxes of handgun target ammo, e.g. 9mm 115gr fmj. Though there is no caliber restriction, we recommend shooting a 9mm or .38 cal, or larger. Winner of the match wins the choice of either a Norco logoed hat or Norco t-shirt. There is no entry fee. A few volunteers should arrive around 11:30am to set up the tables and pins. Our first match is Sunday April 24th. For those on the hunt for ammo, two online stores are targetsportsusa.com and midwayusa.com . We also encourage supporting local gun stores in the area as well big box stores Cabelas and Walmart for ammo. Prices are still higher than pre-covid, but much better than 2021 prices. Don't let your skills get rusty...come on out.
