Norco monthly pistol pin shoots, held the last Sunday of every month, weather permitting, from April-October, from 12N-2PM. These shoots are fun, are open to members and their friends. The objective is to shoot down 6

full-size pins faster than your competitor with a handgun. The shoots are double elimination, whereby everyone will shoot at least twice; those winning through the series will shoot more. Recommend 2 boxes of handgun target ammo, e.g. 9mm 115gr fmj. Though there is no caliber restriction, we recommend shooting a 9mm or .38 cal, or larger. Winner of the match wins the choice of either a Norco logoed hat or Norco t-shirt. There is no entry fee. A few volunteers should arrive around 11:30am to set up the tables and pins. Don't let your skills get rusty...come on out.
